#### Home Build

- We are in the process of completing our **43<sup>rd</sup> home build** since inception in 1993.
- IMPACT-- Habitat homeowners achieve the strength, stability and independence they need to build a better life for themselves and for their families.

Habitat ReStore - continued and improved operations

- The ReStore accepts many items that people no longer want or need, including new and used furniture, appliances, cabinets, doors, windows, sinks, light fixtures, and so much more.
- IMPACT- Keeping useable items out of landfills, providing monetary support to Door County Habitat and offering affordable furniture and appliances to the local community.

Home Repair projects

- 15 completed home repair projects so far in 2020 with more in progress.
- IMPACT- Assisting existing homeowners who are in need of small project repairs on their home at minimal cost.

Deconstruction projects

- 10 opportunities to salvage items before homes were torn down or remodeled.
- IMPACT- Obtaining useable materials and goods for sale in the ReStore.

Operational improvements

- We've been working on ways to reduce operational costs and drive efficiencies throughout our organization.




# Door County Habitat for Humanity by the Numbers


Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2020 (unaudited)








Expenses - \$624,509

# **Key Facts and Figures**

- In 2019 the ReStore kept 224,238 pounds (over 112 tons) of usable material out of landfills.
- We completed 20 Home Repair projects benefiting 19 adults and 18 children in 2019.
- In 2019 alone, 236 Door County Habitat volunteers donated over 11,081 hours with 4,894 hours at the ReStore, 4,500 building our 42nd home, and 845 hours on home repairs. Throughout our 27 year history, we've had over 1,300 active volunteers who worked from Washington Island to Southern Door.
- Habitat homes are in Sturgeon Bay, Sevastopol, Bailey's Harbor, Egg Harbor, Fish Creek, Sister Bay, Liberty Grove, Ellison Bay and Washington Island.
- Habitat built homes generated over \$86,000 2019 property tax dollars in Door County. Those same households added a
  total of \$1.05 million in property tax base since 1993.
- Nearly \$100,000 spent annually with local suppliers and contractors on operations, home build and home repair materials.
